


Holy Gospel

Genesis 11:1-9, Acts 2:1-21, John 14:23-31

The Holy Spirit Gives Peace

Following the flood, Noah's descendants failed to spread out and fill the earth as God had spoken. Rather, they exalted themselves; with "one language and the same words" (Gen. 11:1), they spoke proudly and arrogantly. The Lord humbled them by confusing "the language of all the earth," dividing and dispersing the people (Gen. 11:9). That dispersal was reversed on Pentecost Day (the 50th day of Easter), when God caused the one Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ to be preached in a multitude of languages. "At this sound the multitude came together" (Acts 2:6), for the preaching of Christ is the primary work of the Holy Spirit, whereby He gathers people from all nations into one Church. The Holy Spirit teaches and brings to our remembrance the words of Jesus, which are the words of the Father who sent Him. These words bestow forgiveness and peace to those who keep and hold on to them in love for Jesus. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27).

LIFE THOUGHTS in the CHURCH YEAR

The builders of Babel tried to grasp God's power and prestige for themselves. Their selfishness delivered only division. Physician-assisted suicide, embryo-destroying biotechnologies, and abortion also attempt to exercise God's authority over life and death. But keeping the Word of the Lord—including the encouragement to love even the least of our neighbors—brings people together (Acts 2:9-11) and receives Gospel peace (John 16:23, 27).

TRINITY'S CRY ROOM POLICY

The Divine Service is a gift of God, where our Lord feeds His sheep - of all ages - with the forgiveness of our sins, and the strengthening of our faith.

In addition, having little children in our worship services is both pleasing to the Lord, and a blessing to our church. We love both their presence, as well as hearing their precious voices grace our worship.

It is also very important for parents and grandparents to teach the little children both how to conduct themselves in worship, and the meaning of worship. But this can only be done if the children are present in the worship service.

As a result, the Elders and Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church have prepared the following "Cry Room Policy" for our congregation:

- 1. The use of the Cry Room should ordinarily be limited to pre-school-aged children. Older children are at an age where they are able to learn that Jesus wants them in the worship service, so they can receive His gifts.
- 2. The use of the Cry Room should normally be used for the short period of time necessary to help your child settle down. If small children are allowed to stay in the Cry Room and play with the toys, they will quickly learn to act out in worship in order to get back to the toys.
- 3. Children in the cry room are to be accompanied by at least one parent.
- 4. The use of the Cry Room should normally be used as a last resort, after trying to comfort or speak to your child quietly in the pew.

SUGGESTIONS TO HELP PARENTS WITH YOUNG CHILDREN IN WORSHIP: Parents are encouraged to bring a children's Bible, Bible-story coloring books, Bible story

books, or to use the children's activity bags that are located in the narthex.
